I would like to thank the BCC of GB for their kind invitation to judge males at this show and also exhibitors for their entries.

Whilst very pleased with my principal winners, I was very disappointed with the overall quality, particularly in the younger classes.

I was aghast at the lack of muscle tone, totally unacceptable in a working breed.

Movement was very varied and I found wide fronts, out at elbow, crossing at the back and weak cow hocks. Short upright pasterns and steep upper arms were quite prevalent and combined with the lack of muscle - all resulting in poor untypical movement.

1st Laceway Bite the Bullet (Carley & Fawcett)

Pleasing balanced outline and head of correct proportions. Developing well. Typical type with moderate bone and with correct pasterns and neat feet. Good reach of neck and lay back of shoulder. Very accurate footfall. Good muscle tone. Delighted to see him take BPIS on the referee decision.

2nd Thwaitlake Keep the Buzz (Akester, Wiltshire & Arran)

Super flowing outline, well muscled, with straight front and good layback of shoulder and muscular well angulated stifle. Moved well.

3rd Laceway Black Sabbath (Portman)

PD(8,1)

1st Borderbrook Stolen Affair (Tandy)

Longer cast type with medium bone and correct pasterns. Moved true across and back. Won this class on movement.

2nd Simmovin Charm Writer (Longhurst)

4th in mpd. Took 2nd in this class on movement.

Heavier type. Angulations OK.

3rd Eyes of the World Total Eclipse of the Heart (De Cree & Schevenels)

1st Tonkory You'll See Thwaitlake (Akester & Wiltshire)

Developing well for age. Moderate, well proportioned outline and super croup. Well muscled. Dropped head and moved with minimum lift of feet.

2nd Quintopia Master of Puppets (ai) (Mead & Geering)

This boy is also developing well, with moderate pleasing outline and also dropping head and moving out. Just preferred the layback of shoulder on 1. Two promising young boys.

3rd Borderbrook Stolen Affair (Tandy)

YD (9,2)

1st Arrodare Family Tradition JW (ai) (Green & Paterson)

Moderate, balanced outline, head of good proportions. Straight front and scored over 2nd on rear angulation. Moved well to take the class.

2nd Tonkory Wait and See (Gregory)

Moderate outline. Good reach of neck. Correct slightly sloping pastern and neat feet. Well presented.

3rd Jupavia Divine Dream (Castle)

1st Foxbarton Wayward Prince (Price)

Balanced outline, straight front and neat feet. When dropped head, settled into stride.

2nd Tonkory wait and See (Gregory).

3rd Borderbrook Stolen Affair (Tandy)

1st Malindibeach Woodforde ((Stenson)

Well balanced outline, head of correct proportions. Sraight front and good rear angulation.

When settled, moved well with minimum lift of feet. Well muscled.

2nd Foxbarton Wayward Prince (Price)

3rd Wizaland Put A Sock In It (Knight)

1st Janbell Love in the Dark (Coles)

Scored on balanced outline. Lovely head and oval eye. Good reach of neck and super croup. Good side gait.

2nd Ravenskirk Black Velvet at Windwalker (Leslie)

Heavier type, not as balanced as 1st. Sufficient neck. Not the layback of shoulder of 1st.

3rd Kanamaren Ace of Wands (Henwood)

LD (4,1)

1st Arrodare an Emotion Away (Lee & Ratcliffe)

Smaller type but pleasing flowing outline. Well muscled, good rear angulation. Well let down hocks and neat feet. Balanced, effortless side gait.

2nd Arrodare Wont Back Down (Smith)

Balanced outline and good reach of neck. Good muscle tone and side gait.

3rd Goytre Chance To Reflect (Chance)

OD (12,1)

1st SH CH Thwaitlake Buzzman (Akester & Wiltshire) Dog CC. BIS on referee decision.

Super flowing outline and so well balanced. Correct head proportions with fairly broad skull and oval eye. Good reach of neck. Straight front, well laid back shoulder, good length of upper arm. Excellent rear angulation and strong well let down hocks. Low set tail. Very well muscled and presented in excellent coat and condition. Powered around the ring with reach and drive and minimum lift of feet. Effortless and totally breathtaking! This is how a Border Collie should move! Could have watched him move all day.

2nd Tidespring Storm Breaker (Johson)

Moderate balanced outline. Moved well with typical gait to secure this 2nd place.

3rd CH/IR CH Huntly Forged in Steel for Hysteps (Austin & Zolokova)

1st Chikaramor Cast a Spell of Glenfound (Rettie) RCC

Lovely balanced outline. Moderate bone and excellent rear angulation. Typical smooth, correct border collie movement, covering the ground with minimum lift.

2nd Foxbarton Wayward Prince (Price)

3rd Cookvale Causin a Riot (Joyce & Stamp)

Good Citizen Dog Scheme Dog (3)

1st Janbell Love in the Dark (Coles)

2nd Goytre Chance in a Million (Chance)

Good head patterns. Moderate, slightly longer cast but balanced outline. Not the angulation of 1st.

Strong well let down hocks. Dropped his head and moved out.

3rd Amkamel Half Blood Prince (Buckley)

Veteran Dog (8)

1st Lochiel raise Your Glass to Tonkory (Gregory)

Pleasing balanced outline. Deep chest and well sprung rib. Well angulated fore and aft. Good tail set.

When settled on the move really shows his reach and drive, covering the ground.

2nd Arrodare Just So (Crompton)

Moderate dog with good depth of chest. Pleasing outline but not the angulation of 1st.

Dropped his head and moved out well.

3rd Cookvale Causin a Riot (Joyce & Stamp)
